SERIES NOTES

LEADING OFF

The Chicago Dogs kick off a nine-game road trip with a three-game set against the Lincoln Saltdogs. The Dogs (45-33, 4th North) are coming off of a 6-3 homestand, which included taking two of three against the Association-leading Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks. The Dogs and Saltdogs (35-43, 4th South) have not met this season, and Lincoln took four of five games last year. Game starts are slated for 7:05 PM on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights.

MEN ON THE MOUND

LHP Austin Wright will start the series opener on Monday night at Haymarket Park. Wright was cruising with five shutout frames against the Milwaukee Milkmen on August 8 before finishing with five runs -- three earned -- allowed on seven hits to go with eight strikeouts. It marked Wright's fifth start of the year with at least eight strikeouts. On the season, Wright is 5-6 with a 4.17 ERA, and his 97 strikeouts rank third in the American Association.

Tuesday night's starter is TBD.

LHP D.J. Snelten will get the starting call for the series finale on Wednesday evening. The former San Francisco Giant was spectacular in his last outing, allowing just one earned run on six hits with one walk and a season-high nine strikeouts over seven innings against first-place Fargo-Moorhead. It marked Snelten's second consecutive start of 7 IP, 1 ER and at least five strikeouts. Snelten is 5-3 with a 3.76 ERA this season.

SIMPLY D.O.B.-INANT

Dogs leadoff man David Olmedo-Barreira has been scorching hot at the plate lately, currently riding a 35-game on-base streak. D.O.B. is batting .345 with nine runs scored over his last seven games. On the season, Olmedo-Barrera tied for the team lead with a .323 batting average, which ranks tied for fifth in the American Association.

DYNAMITE DUGAN

Since returning from the DL on July 26, Kelly Dugan has reached base in 14 of 15 games and has six multi-hit games. The Encino, California native launched a grand slam and a three-run homer in the Dogs' 14-7 win over Fargo-Moorhead on Sunday, tying the franchise record with seven RBI in the game. Dugan is batting .324 with eight RBI and seven runs scored over his last nine games.

DOGS DIG THE LONG BALL

The Dogs have slugged 92 home runs this season, the most in the American Association. Keon Barnum and Victor Roache form the 1-2 punch atop the league's home run leaderboard with 23 and 18 homers, respectively. Additionally, Tony Rosselli has and Jordan Dean each have 11 dingers.

The Dogs slugged a franchise-record six home runs in their emphatic 15-2 victory over the St. Paul Saints on August 3.

BIG Z = BACK

The Dogs made national headlines in April when the franchise signed three-time MLB All-Star Carlos Zambrano. The Venezuela native, known as "Big Z," enjoyed a fruitful major league career, which featured an 11-year tenure with the Chicago Cubs and one year with the Miami Marlins. In September 2008, Big Z pitched the only neutral site no-hitter in MLB history. He now makes his return to American professional baseball after launching his comeback in the Mexican League and Venezuelan Winter League.

Zambrano got the start in the Dogs' 14-7 win over Fargo-Moorhead on Sunday, marking his first professional start in Chicago since 2011. Zambrano surrendered three runs -- two earned -- on five hits and four walks with three strikeouts over three innings of work. Big Z has posted a 5.23 ERA in 31 appearances this season, while striking out 35 batters and allowing 14 walks.

TERRIFIC TRIO

The three-headed monster of Casey Crosby, Kyle Halbohn and Rich Mascheri continue to impress in the back end of the Chicago bullpen. Crosby has not allowed an earned run since July 4 -- a span of 16 appearances -- and ranks second on the Dogs with a 1.53 ERA this season. Halbohn has thrived in the closer role with ten saves in ten attempts and has not allowed an earned run since July 6. Halbohn's 1.15 ERA leads all Dogs pitchers. Rich Mascheri held opponents to a .196 batting average throughout the month of July, and is third on the Dogs with a 2.13 ERA this year. Mascheri's 32 appearances are the most of any Dogs pitcher this season.

TREY IS BAE

Dogs slugger Trey Vavra has been a force at the plate lately. Over his past ten games, Vavra slashed a .378 batting average with two homers and 11 RBI. Additionally, Vavra hits a team-leading .421 with runners in scoring position, powering him to a top-three 50 RBI this season. The Menomonie, Wisconsin native owns a 14-game on-base streak.

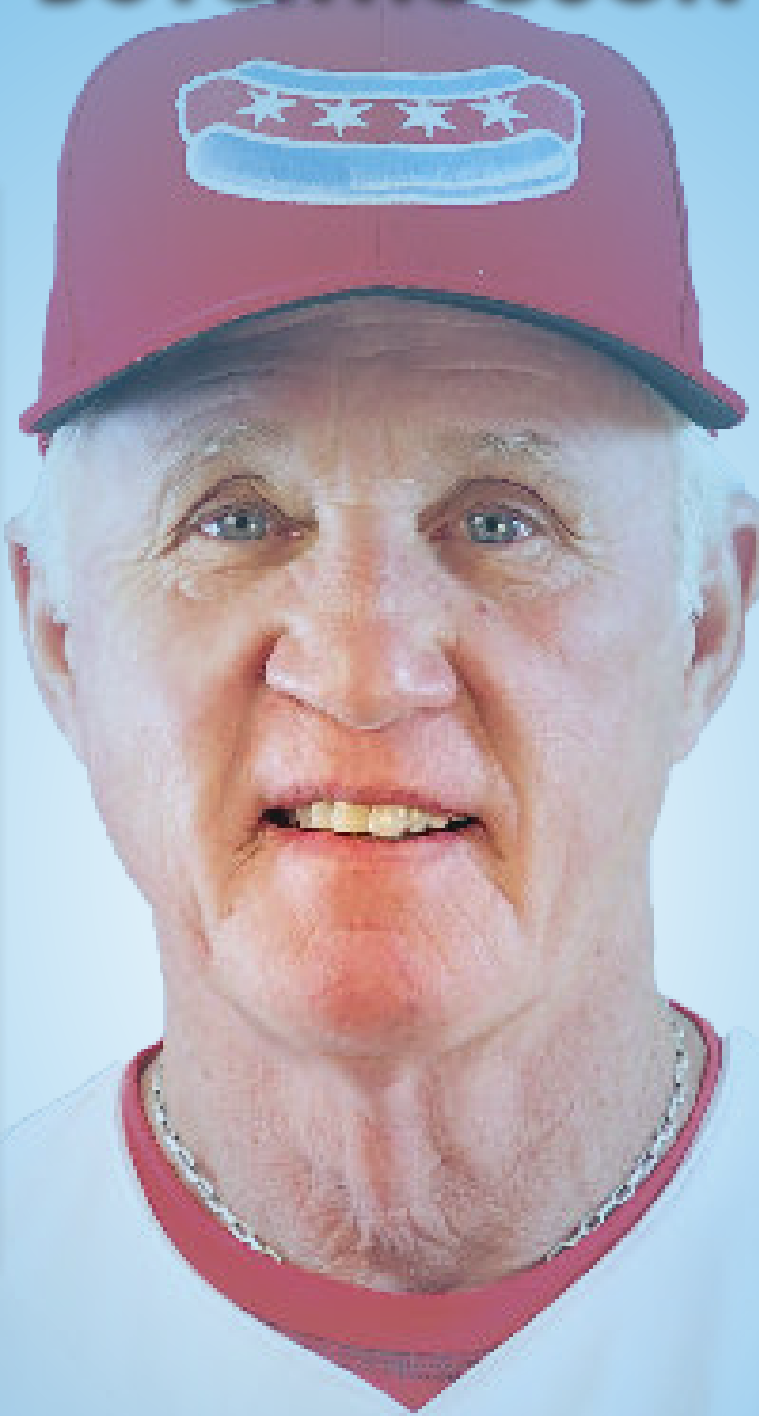

BUTCH HOBSON

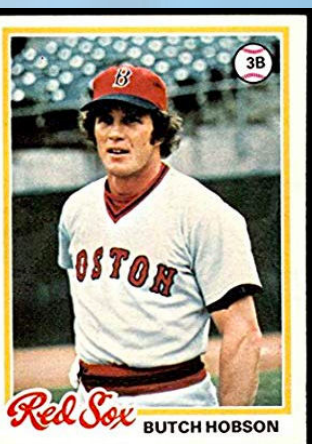


Entering his second season in Chicago, Butch Hobson is the first (and only) manager in Chicago Dogs history. Hobson boasts more than 30 years of experience in both major and minor league baseball, including three seasons as manager of the Boston Red Sox. He is a University of Alabama alumnus who once played as a backup quarterback under coach Bear Bryant.

Hobson is also a former MLB third baseman, having played for the Boston Red Sox (1975-80), California Angels (1981) and New York Yankees (1982). After retiring as a player, Hobson managed the Pawtucket Red Sox before being promoted to Boston. As manager of MLB's Red Sox from 1992-94, Hobson led the team to 207 victories. Hobson has also managed in the Boston Red Sox minor league system, New York Mets minor league system, Philadelphia Phillies minor league system and the Independent Atlantic League's Lancaster Barnstormers, as well as with the Mobile Bay Sharks and Nashua Pride. Hobson most recently served as manager of the Arizona Diamondbacks' Class-A affiliate.

D.J. Boston returns to the Dogs for his second season as the team's hitting coach. A coach in professional baseball since 2008, Boston last served as the as the hitting coach for the Lancaster Barnstormers of the independent Atlantic League. The Cincinnati native then enjoyed a 16-year playing career, including several seasons in the Atlantic League with the Nashua Pride from and with the Bridgeport Bluefish. While in Nashua, Boston played under then-Pride manager and current Dogs manager Butch Hobson. His brother Daryl is the first base coach for the Chicago White Sox.

A Lake Villa, Illinois native, Cory Domel joins the Dogs staff for his first season in Chicago. 2019 marks Domel's 12th season as a pitching coach in independent professional baseball. Domel spent the past six seasons in the Atlantic League leading the rotations for the Somerset Patriots (2013-2017) and Sugar Land Skeeters (2018)—winning championships in 2015 and 2018. During his tenure, Domel's pitching staffs have consistently dominated, including breaking the Atlantic League staff ERA record with a 3.04 mark in 2015. Under Domel's guidance, more than 50 pitchers have been signed by MLB organizations. Prior to his roles in professional baseball, Domel served as a pitching and head coach in the collegiate circuit, getting his start in 2002 at the College of Lake County in Grayslake, Ill.

Carlos Zambrano joins the Chicago Dogs after a 12-year MLB career which included three All-Star nods (2004, 2006, 2008), and playoff appearances in 2003, 2007 and 2008. Three times in his career, he finished fifth in NL Cy Young voting, while giving up the fewest home runs per 9 innings among qualified players in 2004. He also racked up three Silver Slugger awards and hit .238 over his career. After retiring in 2013, he launched his comeback with Los Leones de Yucatan of the Mexican Baseball League in 2018 before a 19-appearance stint in the Venezuelan Winter League with Los Navegantes del Magallanes.

Justin Goossen-Brown joins the Dogs after a wildly successful run at San Diego State University. As a junior, Goossen-Brown made 19 appearances and 10 starts, which included striking out ten batters and not surrendering a walk in his first start, becoming the first Aztec pitcher since 2015 to do so. Goossen-Brown continued his success as a senior, where he recorded a 3.80 ERA with 73 strikeouts in 20 appearances (14 starts) while posting a 6-5 record. Prior to his time at SDSU, Goossen-Brown spent two seasons at Los Angeles Valley College, where he was named to the All-Western State Conference-South second team as a relief pitcher. He is the younger brother of fellow Dogs RHP Josh Goossen-Brown.

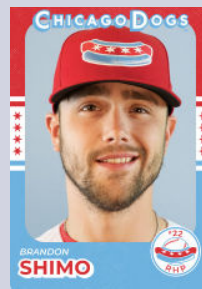
